## PRESS RELEASE

The Garonne River divides Bordeaux's urban fabric in two, and its right bank has lagged somewhat in terms of its development. With the Bastide-Niel urban development, the city of Bordeaux is aiming to bring the two banks closer together by creating new centres and increasing the density of these spaces.

The city's analysis of the programme for this zone has impelled it to provide optimal, comfortable, and durable spaces for this new neighbourhood. It has also sought to enhance existing industrial heritage and, thus, to preserve the identity of this area.


We created a symbiosis between existing walls, which we highlighted, and the new buildings inserted within them, as an architectural version of a Russian doll.

The project includes six distinct blocks that implement the principles of this urban development, featuring roofs with multiple slopes. The layout of those blocks and the treatment of the common areas help recreate a neighbourhood atmosphere within an ambitious landscaping scheme extending across the entire development zone.

The housing provides generous volumes and views of the entire area, as well as large open terraces.

The materiality of these various volumes is inspired by the mineral imprint of pre-existing buildings. The chamfered sections are clad in a stone-tinted ceramic along the facade, and in a coloured stone-tinted concrete for the walls.

Vestiges of the volumes of existing buildings have been represented in the face through the use of a smooth concrete tinted in grey.






Site Plan **1/1000** 












Northeast facade of Buildings D and E 1/250





Section of Building D 1/250




Northeast facade of Building B 1/250

Ground floor plan **1/500** 









First floor plan **1/500** 






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

Founded in 2006, Atelier Cambium is an architecture firm with offices in Bordeaux and Paris. The firm develops housing, offices, and hotels, both through new constructions and renovations Directed by Olivier Laurent, architect, and Franck Ferrier, construction and project manager, the twenty-member team comes from a variety of backgrounds. The team possesses extensive building know-how, which it routinely implements in the projects that it conducts from start to finish. The firm's work has received numerous architecture awards and is regularly featured in publications, conferences, and specialised exhibitions. Among the ongoing projects, the Îlot Saint Louis is one of the nine highlighted by the Bordeaux City Hall under the "Bâtiment Frugal Bordelais" label. This distinction, like other projects developed according to the "Bâtiments Durables Nouvelle Aquitaine" approach, reflects Atelier Cambium's strong commitment to the sustainability of the projects it designs and builds. This commitment is demonstrated in various ways: enhancing existing structures, adopting frugal design principles, using bio-based and/or geo-sourced materials, anticipating maintenance needs, and more.

The complex rehabilitations (redevelopments, extensions, changes of use, etc.) carried out in recent years fully align with this approach and, more broadly, follow the history of European architecture, which has often seen cities rebuild upon themselves.

In 2022, Atelier Cambium acquired Deshoulières Jeanneau Architectes, an architectural firm specialising in public facilities (conservatories, multimedia libraries, university centres, institutional buildings).

#### About OLGGA

Driven by the shared joy of designing, OLGGA's Guillaume Grenu and Nicolas Le Meur have championed an architecture that is bold, honest, and responsible.

For OLGGA, constructing first of all means confronting a territory, interacting with a site, and embracing the existing topography.
